- **What is a minor?**
 - Additional Class work in a focused area.
- **What are the benefits of a Business Minor?**
 - Added knowledge allowing you to own/manage a construction business.
 - A step toward obtaining an MBA degree in future.
 - An extra credential on your resume’.
- **What are the requirements for a Business Minor?**
 - Declare your intent to College of Business in Jr. Year.
 - Prerequisite Class work: (2.25 GPA in these 5)
 - Economics: ECON-1150 & ECON-1200
 - Mathematics: MATH-2450
 - Computing: ENGT-1050
 - Statistics: ENGT-3010
 - BUAD-2040 (or ACTG-1040) Financial Accounting **
 - Three of the following 8 courses (one 3000 level).
 - BUAD 1010 (BMGT-1010) Introduction to Business
 - BUAD 2050 (ACTG-1050) Managerial Accounting **
 - BUAD 2070 Application of Statistics in Bus. Decision
 - BUAD 2080 (BMGT-2110) Global Env.of Business **
 - BUAD 3010 Principles of Marketing**
 - BUAD 3020 Principles of Mfg. & Service Systems**
 - BUAD 3030 Managerial & Behavioral Processes in Org**
 - BUAD 3040 Principles of Financial Management**
 - BUAD-3050 Information Technology Management
 - Two more courses at 3000 level from above or from ACCT, FINA, ISOM, MGMT or MKTG divisions.
- With proper course selection, this minor can be achieved with Social Science and Professional Development electives adding only 3 more courses!
- C Grade or better required in all minor required classes.

Other Minors

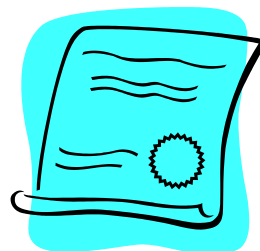
- **Minor in Studio Fine Arts**
 - Preparation for possible master's degree in Architecture.
 - Requires the following coursework:
 - ART 1080 Drawing I (3 hours)
 - ART 2050 Foundations 2-D Design (3 hours)
 - ART 2060 Foundations 3-D Design (3 hours)
 - 15 hours of classes in areas of Drawing, Printmaking, Metals, Ceramics, Sculpture, Painting, Photography, Cyber Art or Design, with no more than 9 hours in one studio area. A minimum of 6 hours must be in courses at the 3000-level and above.
- **Minor in Public Administration**
 - Preparation for career as a public works administrator, city manager or commissioner.
 - Requires the following coursework:
 - PSC 3420 Principles of Public Administration
 - PSC 3110 Social Science Statistics
 - PSC 4180 Computer Apps in Public Administration

Part A - Two courses from the following:

 - PSC 4370 Administrative Behavior
 - PSC 4430 Public Personnel Administration
 - PSC 4440 Budgeting and Financial Administration
 - PSC 4460 Policy and Administration
 - PSC 4470 Public Organization Theory

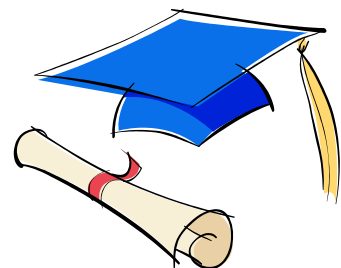

Graduate Degrees

- While not exclusionary, ET degrees are not traditionally set up for continuing your education with graduate degrees.
- Allows for specialization in a field of interest that can compliment a CET degree.
- Most graduate programs have stringent admissions requirements:
 - Undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or higher.
 - Letters of recommendation.
 - Some type of qualifying exam (GRE, GMAT, LSAT....)
 - Statement of purpose.
 - Portfolio of prior work.
- Graduate studies may also require “bridge courses” to make up for deficiencies you have from your baccalaureate degree.
- Graduate tuition is usually double that of undergraduate tuition.
- Graduate coursework is usually more intense, complex and demanding. You are expected to actively participate in the learning process!
- Normally 30-45 semester credit hours required for Master’s degree.
- Usually includes a thesis or major project.
- Investigate graduate work early to be prepared for the possibility of continuing your education.



Possible Graduate Programs

The graduate programs listed below are the most beneficial for CET career advancement.

- **Master of Science in Engineering (MSE)**

- Administered by ET Department.
- Generic cross-disciplinary degree with business.
- Focuses on management of technology.
- Good resume' builder for seasoned grads looking for advancement in their career.

- **Master of Science in Civil Engineering (MSCE)**

- Good for further discipline specialized study in Civil area.
- May require bridge courses dependent on specialty.

- **Master of Business Administration (MBA)**

- Allows for high level administration in corporations.

- **Master of Public Administration (MPA)**

- Allows for placement and advancement in city, county and state public service.
- Construction and public works administration is a good fit.

- **Law Degree (JD)**

- Legal requirements abound in construction.
- UT COE offers an MS/JD combination.
- Requires 89 semester hours.



- **Master of Science in Geology (MSG)**

- Allows for specialized work in geotechnical field.
- Environmental construction work and development.

- **Master of Architecture (M.Arch)**

- CET and Architecture a very good combination.
- Currently not available in NW Ohio.
- Certification regulated by NCARB and may not lead to registration as a licensed architect.
- May require portfolio and studio experience.
- Not all Arch. programs may accept the BSCET grad.
